FATHER DAVE

I found out last weekend that you listen to my homilies. Several of you pointed out that I had neglected to mention the religious vocation last Sunday. I did not mention it on purpose. I wanted to emphasize the vocations strengthened by sacraments, the vocations to holy orders and to marriage. The commitment of our married couples to their sacramental vocation enables the ordained priests and deacons remain committed to their sacramental vocation. The commitment of the ordained to their sacramental vocation enables married couples to remain faithful to their sacramental vocation.

I could have mentioned that God calls some people to live as widows or widowers, some as divorced people, others as unmarried and celibate people. He also calls some to the religious life in monasteries, in convents or among the people in ordinary houses. He also calls people to volunteer work, to professional work, to other kinds of work. I could not mention all last week, but I wanted to emphasize those who receive a special sacrament with their vocation. At some other time, I may mention other vocations.

LITURGY: OUR YEAR REVOLVES AROUND EASTER. 2

What importance does Easter have? The fact that we spend one seventh of each week and one seventh of each year celebrating it should give us the idea that it has great importance. Every Sunday celebrates the resurrection, which explains why we use the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary on all Sundays. The Easter Triduum and the Easter season take up fifty-three days, one seventh of the year.

The season of Lent lasts forty days, from the first Sunday of Lent to the afternoon of Holy Thursday. The first four days of Lent came into the calendar later. In the Liturgy of the Hours, we use the psalms for the fourth week for these days rather than the psalms for the first week, as we normally do at the start of liturgical season. The Liturgy of the Hours has arranged the 150 psalms into a four-week cycle.

The Advent and Christmas season together take up forty-three of forty-four days, depending on what day of the week Christmas comes on. Ordinary Time, which means the times marked by ordinal numbers takes either thirty-three or thirty-four weeks.

Taken together the year takes up either 365 or 366 days.
