FATHER DAVE

I want to bring you up to date on the septic systems at Holy Family. The Darke County Health Department has conducted a survey of septic systems in the rural areas of the county. It found the well, septic system and permit for the hall, but did not find a permit for the rectory. It did not look at the church. Because we could not show a permit for work done at the rectory, we had to apply for a permit. When I went down to the Health Department, I found that because we have a commercial classification as a church, we needed to consult with the EPA. We have done this, and the EPA has told us what we have to do for the church and rectory to prevent any seepage into a tributary of Indian Creek.

Monday we had a soil scientist come out from Lebanon. He took core samples from possible leach fields. We await his report to us in writing. Once we have this, then we shall contact civil engineers to prepare the forms we need to bring us into conformity with the law. Joe Miller from the EPA has given us the names of engineers, but he cannot recommend one over the other. We shall keep you posted as we work to prevent discharge of wastewater to the streams and rivers of the state. Our parish's work in this regard provides an example of our commitment to life issue affecting life.

LITURGY: SACRAMENTS

Sacraments bring us the activity and presence of Christ through signs. These signs come to us through the Church, made present to us through the ministry of the Church. Oil by itself means nothing until the Church anoints in confirmation or in the sacrament of the sick. Bread, wine and water mean nothing until the Church uses them in the Eucharist or in baptism. The Church, through the minister, makes Christ present to bring us his saving power.

The same holds for the proclamation of the Scriptures at Mass. The word of God comes to us, not in a book, but in the proclamation made by the appointed person at Mass. To read a book during the proclamation of the readings means to miss the presence of Christ among us at this time.

The first reading today explains how Ezra the priest proclaimed the word of God and the people listened attentively. The gospel tells how the Lord Jesus read the word of God and the people listened. The Church directs us to listen to the word proclaimed and not to read from a book. I see parents training their children to read along instead of listening, but the proclamation of the Scriptures should not turn into reading lesson. The Scriptures today demonstrate how we should listen. The act of listening enables us to receive better the presence of Christ in our midst during the proclamation of the Sacred Scripture. Listen without reading along.


