#### FATHER DAVE

We have a full moon this weekend. It came yesterday. We always have one either on this Sunday of Lent or within four days of this day. This puts us within a month of the first full moon after the first of spring, which determines the date of Easter. One story has it that the transfiguration of the Lord took place forty days before Palm Sunday, but I cannot vouch for the accuracy of this. I do know that the presence of the full moon on the Second Sunday of Lent may explain why in the readings for this Sunday we have had a gospel of the transfiguration of the lord for centuries. The Lord shows us his radiance as the moon shows us hers.

# LENT

On Tuesday of this past week, the Church gave us the Our Father as an example of how we should pray. I started thinking about how the prayer has changed over the years. We now use the doxology in the Roman Rite at Mass and in some of our rituals for sacramentals. We use it in some of our Catholic table blessings, for we do have other forms than the familiar "Bless us, O Lord." We do not use the doxology in the ritual for the seven sacraments, except for Mass.

The doxology has an ancient history. It appears is a note in the margin of some ancient texts of the gospel. The Eastern Catholic Church has used it for centuries in a somewhat different form. The Protestant communities use it even though many, as I understand, understand that the oldest texts of the gospels do not contain it.

It comes from a Catholic tradition and remains a part of our Catholic tradition even though we do not use it in our daily praying of the Our Father.


## 2007 ARCHDIOCESAN ANNUAL FUND

#### FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Fast days (less food to eat, affects those between ages of 18 and 59): Good Friday (optional for Holy Saturday) [includes abstinence].

Abstinence (no meat. Affects those 14 and over): All Fridays during Lent [on Fridays during the year we may substitute works of charity for abstaining].

The obligation does allow some leeway. If your host serves you meat, eat it. If you order it by mistake, eat it. You do not need a dispensation or permission from the pastor for this. If you have a god reason, you may eat meat on Fridays at Lent at times.

# MICROPHONES IN CHURCH

This past week we upgraded the microphones at both churches. Holy Family now has a separate microphone for the deacon and priest; they no longer have to share one frequency. We replaced the gooseneck with a quieter microphone and added a microphone for the choir loft. St Denis how has a better microphone for the priest and will soon have replaced the dead cords on the deacon's microphone. This should give us better sound in both parishes.
