At the Ester Vigil we celebrate baptism, the baptism of new converts and the anniversary of the baptism of the rest of us. At the Easter Vigil, we celebrate the night of the Passover, our Passover from sin to grace, from death to life. We take time to do this; mass takes longer, but it flows smoothly. If you have never celebrated with us at the Easter Vigil, plan to do so this year.

THE EUCHARIST

Holy Communion means sharing in the Eucharist with Christ really present. It means believing in the reality of what we proclaim at Mass, that at the prayer of the community, led by a priest, the Spirit of God changes bread and wine into the real body and blood of the Lord Jesus. The appearances of bread and wine remain, but the reality, or substance, of the bread and wine has changed. In the Eucharist, then, we have the risen Lord Jesus present in the Eucharist and received by those receiving communion. This presence means that we receive his Body and Blood, his soul and his divinity, his full humanity in glory with the fullness of his divineness, the full person of Christ with his human and divine natures intact and glorious.
