READINGS FOR THE TRIDUUM

Thursday: We hear the story of the first paschal lamb (Exodus 12). Psalm 116 calls us to take up the cup of salvation; St Paul recounts how the early Christians celebrated the Eucharist (1 Corinthians 11:23-26). John describes Jesus' last supper (John 13:1-15).

Friday: We hear of the one wounded for our sins (Isaiah 52:13-53:12). The psalmist commends himself to the Lord (Psalm 31). The author speaks of Jesus as the source of eternal salvation (Hebrews 4:14-16; 5:7-9). In John's account Jesus enters his passion like a King going to his crowning (John 18-19).

Easter Vigil: This night of re-creation starts with the account of creation (Genesis 1:1-2:2). It continues with the sacrifice Abraham made (Genesis 22:1-18). The third reading tells of the exodus from Egypt (Exodus 14:15-15:1). We switch to the prophet Isaiah who proclaims God's enduring love for us (54:5-14). Through Isaiah God invites us into his everlasting covenant (55:1-11). The prophet Baruch exhorts us to walk toward the light of the Lord (3:9-15, 32-4:4). The prophet Ezekiel sees how God will use water in his covenant (36:16-17a, 18-28). Paul then explains baptism as immersion into the dying and rising of Jesus (Romans 6:3-11). The women bring the good news of resurrection (Luke 24:1-12).

Easter Sunday: Peter proclaims the resurrection on the Pentecost (Acts 10). We rejoice on the day the Lord has made (Psalm 118). Let us celebrate the feast of the paschal lamb (1 Corinthians 5). Mary Magdalene announces the resurrection (John 20)

FATHER DAVE

Last Monday we celebrated the Annunciation of the Lord. When Mary accepted the angel's message, the Word of God took flesh in her womb and she bore the Son of God. The same thing happens to us. When we accept the word of God into our lives, God takes flesh in our lives. What happened in a singular fashion to Mary does not happen only to her; it happens also to us. When you hear the bless ring at 6:00 and at noon, remember the annunciation and God's call to you to let his Word take flesh in you.

LITURGY: THE TRIDUUM

Holy Thursday celebrates the Lord's gift of the eucharist and of the ordained priesthood that makes the eucharist possible. It also celebrated the Lord's command to love and serve each other. The last gives Holy Thursday the name Maundy Thursday, the Thursday of the mandate (It does not misspell Monday). We have adoration after Mass for as long as people come (until midnight).

Good Friday's liturgical service has three parts: (1) Liturgy of the Word; (2) veneration of the glorious cross; (3) Liturgy of Communion. We do not celebrate Mass on Good Friday. We do have stations of the cross forty-five minutes before the liturgy.

Holy Saturday, the climax of the year, starts in darkness, at nine o'clock. The Mass has four parts: (1) Fire and Light; (2) Liturgy of the Word; (3) Liturgy of baptism; (4) Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Easter Sunday 1: At this point we start fifty days of celebrating. We celebrate what happened at the Easter Vigil, the resurrection and the gift of baptism with the gifts of the Holy Spirit.
