READINGS FOR THE TRIDUUM

Thursday: We hear the story of the first paschal lamb (Exodus 12). Psalm 116 calls us to take up the cup of salvation; St Paul recounts how the early Christians celebrated the Eucharist (1 Corinthians 11:23-26). John describes Jesus' last supper (John 13:1-15).

Friday: We hear of the one wounded for our sins (Isaiah 52:13-53:12). The psalmist commends himself to the Lord (Psalm 31). The author speaks of Jesus as the source of eternal salvation (Hebrews 4:14-16; 5:7-9). In John's account Jesus enters his passion like a King going to his crowning (John 18-19).

Easter Vigil: This night of re-creation starts with the account of creation (Genesis 1:1-2:2). It continues with the sacrifice Abraham made (Genesis 22:1-18). The third reading tells of the exodus from Egypt (Exodus 14:15-15:1). We switch to the prophet Isaiah who proclaims God's enduring love for us (54:5-14). Through Isaiah God invites us into his everlasting covenant (55:1-11). The prophet Baruch exhorts us to walk toward the light of the Lord (3:9-15, 32-4:4). The prophet Ezekiel sees how God will use water in his covenant (36:16-17a, 18-28). Paul then explains baptism as immersion into the dying and rising of Jesus (Romans 6:3-11). The gospel proclaims the resurrection of the Lord Jesus (Mark 16:1-7).

READINGS FOR THE TRIDUUM (CONTINUED)

Sunday: Peter proclaims the resurrection of the Lord (Acts 10:34a, 37-43). The Lord has made this day (Psalm 118). The resurrection means a change in our behavior (1 Corinthians 5:6b-8). The Easter Sequence follows. We hear about the empty tomb (John 20:1-9).

FAIRER DAVE

We start the biggest celebration of the year Thursday, the celebration of Easter. The sacred Triduum lasts seventy-two hours. It runs from Thursday evening through Sunday evening.

We have plenty of room at both times on Thursday and Friday. You can come early or come late and you should find room.

The celebration focuses on preparation for baptism. For us baptized, we celebrate the Eucharist on Thursday. For the elect, those preparing for baptism, we make this triduum a retreat preparing them for baptism. We fast and abstain with them on Good Friday and Holy Saturday. The elect will go through the death and resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil when they receive Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. They, together with the candidates for full union with the Church, will gather on Holy Saturday from 1:00 to 3:00 for the immediate preparation for baptism. We ask you to join us at this retreat from 1:00 to 3:00 on Saturday. If you cannot come to church, pray with us at home.

LENT

Fasting, eating less food, obliges those 18 to 59 on Good Friday. Abstaining from meat obliges all over 14 on Good Friday. We also recommend them on Holy Saturday. If your host graciously offers you meat, or if you have no choice, eat it gratefully.
