FATHER DAVE

Our bishops this week have considered changing the translation for some prayers of the Mass. They have considered changing the response to the priest's greeting, "The Lord be with you" to "And also with your spirit." Someone asked why. I shall try to explain. In the early days of the vernacular liturgy, we had to translate Latin prayers into English. At the same time many Protestant groups had need to make their services more modern. Both they and we, then, faced the task of translating much the same prayers. So we ended up translating them together and agreed on these translations. Lutherans, Episcopalians, Methodists, Catholics and others have used, for the most part, the same words for the Glory to God, the Lamb of God, and the responses.

The greeting, "The Lord be with you", Catholics reserve to the ordained priest and deacon. Protestants, for the most part, do not claim an ordained priesthood and emphasize the priesthood common to all of us through Baptism. The response, "And also with you" has suited them fine. The translation more faithful to the Latin, "And with your spirit" fits Catholics better because the Spirit refers to the gift of the Spirit the priest and deacon have received in ordination.

We Catholics generally reserve the term ministry to the apostolate of the ordained. We do speak of Eucharistic ministers because they function in place of the ordained Eucharistic minister. We have used the term lay ecclesial ministry for those especially trained, but as a rule we do not speak of ministry in the broad terms that Protestants do. We speak of areas of service, mission or apostolate and value them as much as we value those engaged in ministry. Each of us fits in as the Lord calls us to service.
