FAIRER DAVE

We ought to fill the church from the front to the back, not from the back to the front. One person I spoke to years ago about this told me that he thought filling the church from the rear showed a lack of hospitality and welcoming. Most people I know would certainly deny this criticism.

I do not think our people sit in the back to see what people wear to church, or to see who comes late or to look at fashion statements. I hope that having a fourth station for communion does not encourage you to fill in from the back.

I suspect that the ultimate reason comes down to two passages in Luke's gospel. Luke, in the story of the Pharisee and the publican, or tax collector (18: 914), tells of the boastful prayer of the Pharisee who took a front seat and how the Lord praised the humbleness of the sinner who stayed in the background. In the parable of the guests (14:7-14), he tells of the presumptuous guest who had to take the last place when someone more important came in. In neither of these does the Lord Jesus praise people merely for sitting in the back. He commends humility, which means something entirely different. Humility calls us to the front because the Master of the Feast has called us up higher. More to come.

LITURGY

"How late can I come to Mass before I have to go again?" I think of this as a question we should not ask. The whole of Mass makes up one integral whole. Its two principal parts follow a brief introduction and come before a brief concluding rite. Deliberately to come late or to leave early would constitute a breach in politeness and courtesy; morally we call this behavior a sin. Deliberately to miss the Liturgy of the Word or the Liturgy of the Eucharist would constitute a greater lack of courtesy; morally we call this behavior a greater, even mortal, sin.

Oops. I must back up here. I emphasize the word deliberately. You cannot sin by accident. You can only sin by wanting to sin. The more serious your responsibility, the more serious the excuse you need not to fulfill the responsibility. If you cannot come to Mass, because of sickness, lack of transportation or some other reasonable excuse, you commit no sin at all by not coming.
