**FATHER DAVE**

I once had a campaign to move people to the front of church. I called it a serious campaign, not without humor. I would not want a serious campaign with no humor or a humorous campaign with no seriousness. This means that you show no disrespect and commit no sin by sitting in the back and not moving up.

Let me offer this as a good reason for gathering in the church. When we gather for the Eucharist, our coming together makes Christ present to each other just as much as the proclamation of the Sacred Scriptures and the Eucharist make Christ present. So long as the species remain, the Lord's presence remains with us. Obviously the Lord's presence in the Eucharist lasts longer than the assembly and the proclamation of the Sacred Scriptures. The fact that you have gathered together, wherever in the gathering, means that Christ has come to us in each other.

Next week, we shall look at some good reasons why we can sit where we do. We do have to reserve a back pew for ushers.

**LITURGY**

The Church gives us greater encouragement to receive communion from the cup now than it used to. Before the revisions introduced several years ago, at the communion the priest held up only the host when he invited the people to communion. Now he may hold up both the host and the cup at that time.

The Church knows the complete presence of Christ in each form, bread and wine. The Church also knows that physically eating and drinking form part of our ordinary experience of feasting. For this reason the Church encourages all to receive from the plate and the cup, from the Body and the Blood of Christ.
