I should not find myself surprised at this. The Lord measures greatness by service, not by adulation. The great-nephew rewarded me for taking him swinging, to the dirt pile and to see the "oouhOOus", or trains, by giving me something to think about. He also said my name and shared his popcorn with me.

In the end, he made sure that I took Napoleon home with me because Napoleon may not stay with him, according to the house rules. Napoleon usually stays in my automobile lest I forget him. You could call him my carpet.

SILENCE IN THE LITURGY, PART 3

The lectors have not suddenly come down with amnesia or lost their place in the lectionary. They have started pausing after the readings to allow us time to reflect on the sacred texts they have proclaimed. The priest and deacon allow time after the second reading before the Gospel. The Gospel Acclamation forms an integral whole with the gospel and so has no break between it and the gospel. The pause after the homily allows all to reflect more on the gospel and apply the homily to self.

(When possible the responsorial psalm takes place at the ambo, or pulpit. It forms a unity with the first reading and an integral part of the proclamation of the Sacred Scriptures.)


