FAIRER DAVE

RCIA stand for The Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults and Older Children. The process involves leading people toward initiation into the Church. It does not try to teach a person all he or she could possibly know about the Church. It does, however, introduce the participants to Christ in his Church and in his sacraments. It leads to full initiation into the Church through baptism, confirmation and the Eucharist.

The RCIA program has no strings attached. Those merely interested in the Catholic faith, checking it out, or wanting to joint will find themselves welcomed equally.

Some people wait until someone else invites them. I know of one man who went to Mass with his family, helped at Catholic events, but only fully entered the Church after someone asked him. Whom should you ask and invite? Would you come with someone to help that person feel more comfortable about looking into the Church? You could serve as a godparent or sponsor for this person if this person should decide to enter the Church.

SILENCE IN THE LITURGY, PART 4

We use silence for several purposes. Silence can help us ponder our sinfulness and appreciate God's forgiveness, as it does during the Penitential Rite. It can help us organize what we want to ask God for, as it does in the silence before the Opening Prayer, or Collect. It can help us reflect on the message God gives us in the readings. It can also enable us to praise God.

We usually do not think of praising God in silence, but we can and we should. We use silence after the communion before the Prayer after Communion to praise God together in silence. We provide this silence for praising God, not for getting gear together to go home.


