MASSES ON NOVEMBER 1 AND 2

On November 1, we celebrate the feast of All Saints. We celebrate it as a holyday of obligation and attend Mass that day, as we do on Sundays. We have Masses for the Holyday on Wednesday, November 1, at 10:30 at Holy Family, and at 5:00 the evening before at St Denis, and at 6:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday at St Denis.

I look to our youth to volunteer at the 6:30 Mass since many come to Mass before going to school. We do need volunteers at each other Mass, and hope many volunteer.

The next day, we commemorate all the faithful departed. We have Mass at 8:00 a.m. and at 7:30 p.m. At the 7:30 Mass we shall also pray in a special way for all parishioners who have died in the pat twelve months.

FAIRER DAVE

I enjoyed the first session of New Beginnings. The presenters got me to think. In speaking of us as the body of Christ, they referred us to 1 Corinthians 12:12-26. There Paul speaks of the more presentable parts and the less honorable parts. The less honorable we clothe with special care and honor, while the more presentable ones we do not. In other words, we do not cover the face, the hands and feet, but cover other parts.

Paul refers to us, the Church, as a body. We only assign special honor and reverence to certain members of the body and we call them, "Father", "Reverend"; the rest we do not. I think this means that the Lord has taken priests and deacons from the less honorable members of the Church and the average lay person from the more presentable parts of the Body of Christ. I see that this fits in with the work of the priest; he serves as the garbage collector by forgiving sins and helping people out of the mud and filth of sin.

LITURGY

The liturgy includes Mass, the other six sacraments, the Liturgy of the Hours, blessings and other rituals. In all liturgical actions, the Church prays publicly. In all of them, Christ does something, and all prayer goes to the Father through him. Because the Church prays in Christ's name in liturgical prayer, the Church has official books to regulate it. If the leader does not follow the book, he turns the public prayer of the Church into his own private prayer.

I want to apply this briefly to baptism and matrimony. When someone baptizes, Christ baptizes. Or this reason, we do not repeat baptism. It does not matter who functions as minister of the sacrament, priest, Protestant minister, non-Christian, Christ baptizes through the actions of the minister. If someone baptizes a child behind the backs of the parents, because the parents have delayed baptism, the child receives baptism and the priest may not and cannot rebaptize the child.

When two baptized people validly marry, Christ unites them in marriage, and they both receive the sacrament of marriage in a bond that the Church cannot break. When only one of the two of neither of two has received baptism, neither receives the sacrament of marriage.

FINANCE COMMISSION


