FATHER DAVE

I feel embarrassed. Usually the campaign for Human Development falls on the second to last Sunday in November, the Feast of Christ the King. Christ the King, however, sometimes comes during the Thanksgiving weekend, the fourth weekend. When this happens the Campaign for Human Development comes on the week before the feast. This tells me that the Campaign always comes on the Sunday before Thanksgiving. At any rate, I messed up and wrote last week's bulletin, thinking the Campaign would come during the Thanksgiving break. I had it wrong. The collection for the Campaign for Human Development takes place this weekend. We shall send the whole collection to Cincinnati except what we find labeled for the parish, Maryknoll or some other cause. I ask your pardon.

LITURGY

Someone asked to explain why we do what we do in liturgy, in particular why we wear the colors we wear. We divide the Church's year into four major seasons and one long period as follows: Easter; Lent; Christmas; Advent and Ordinary Time, which lasts thirty-three or thirty-four weeks. Ordinary Time does not mean ordinary as we usually think of ordinary, things that happen the same way most of the time. In our context, ordinary time means ordered time, time designated by ordinal numerals. Ordinary here means ordered; the Latin uses a different term that means "Throughout the Year."

Throughout this ordered time called ordinary, we use green vestments. During Easter and Christmas we use white. During Lent and Advent we use violet. We use red for Palm Sunday, Good Friday, Pentecost and the celebrations of martyrs. We use white for saints who did not die as martyrs. We may use white or violet or black for funerals.


