FATHER DAVE

Someone asked what RCIA stands for. It stands for The Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults. It describes the process of learning how to live, believe and act as a Catholic. It involves learning session, ritual experiences, and practical applications. It means a walk into deeper communion with Christ, a walk taken, not alone, but with a sponsor, the Church's gift to the candidate. The Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults tells us that the Church takes seriously the commitment of people to the Church. The Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults also applies to children of catechetical age, those old enough for school.

LITURGY

Since the Second Vatican Council we have celebrated the sacraments in the conjunction with a Liturgy of the Word. This holds even for the sacrament of penance. This sacrament has two common forms, individually and communally. The mentioning of sins and the absolution from sin we also do quietly, one on one. The communal form emphasizes that we all have sinned and need forgiveness. In the communal form, we celebrate this forgiveness together. In the communal form we can see better the divisive nature of sin and the bonding power of forgiveness and love.

During Advent and Lent we use communal penance services to call us all back to the Lord with ready hearts. This Advent we have scheduled penance services with absolution for the next two Thursdays, December 14 and 21. This Thursday we shall have at least two priests available; the week after we shall have at least four. I encourage all of you to use the sacrament of penance during Advent. We have listed a schedule elsewhere in the bulletin.
