READINGS FOR THE HOLYDAY AND NEXT WEEKEND

August 14: David brought the Ark of the Lord to Jerusalem (1 Chronicles 15:3-4, 15-16; 16, 1-2). The psalm serves as a processional to Jerusalem (Psalm 132). God clothes the mortal with immortality (1 Corinthians 15:54b-57). Jesus proclaims those who hear the word of God and keep it blessed (Luke 11:27-28).

August 15: The voice announces that the Kingdom of God has come (Revelation 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab). The queen stands at the king's right hand (Psalm 45). God raised Christ first, then he will raise up the rest of us (1 Corinthians 15:20-27). The Mother of the Lord meets Elizabeth the Mother of John (Luke 1:39-56).
