#### FATHER DAVE

We have a serious obligation to take part in the Sunday Eucharist on every Sunday and Holyday of Obligation. A serious obligation requires serious reasons not to fulfill it. Sickness, bad health, pressing family needs, severe weather conditions, serious work obligations and such can negate the serious obligation. The impossibility of fulfilling an obligation negates the obligation. Unintentional forgetting an obligation and remembering it afterwards does not negate an obligation, but it does render the forgetter innocent of sin because the one who forgot did not have an opportunity to decide not to fulfill the obligation.

If a person can gather for the Eucharist without serious inconvenience, the person ought to. People with serious health problems sometimes consider that, if they had tried harder, they could have made it. Sometimes they try in very bad weather or with great physical impairment to come to Mass. Sometimes their driving creates hazards for others. Such have a valid excuse for not gathering with us for the Eucharist although they want to and we miss them. Mere age, however, does not excuse; hundred year olds have the same obligations younger people have, unless they have serious health problems.

Wanting to gather for the Eucharist and not having the ability or the occasion can make people disappointed in themselves, but feeling sad about missing Mass through no fault of their own does not make them guilty even though they have guilt feelings. Guilt feelings do not make them guilty.

We can only sin when we can or should have the ability to choose between good and evil. If we cannot choose, we cannot sin. To make a long article short, if you missed the Holyday on December 8 because you forgot, had the wrong Mass schedule or had to work and could not get out of it, you did not sin.

#### LITURGY AND SILENCE

We use silence to allow God to draw us more deeply into his mystery. The Three-Minute Catechesis last Sunday identified several times when we should have silence. During the Penitential Rite, we pause to reflect on our sinfulness and before the Opening Prayer we pause to make out personal intentions. Before the first reading and after the first and second reading and the homily, we observe silence to prepare to listen to the readings and to reflect on the passages proclaimed. We also sit and observe silence after the bustle of the communion procession has ended, this time to join in praise of God.


