FATHER DAVE

I thoroughly enjoyed the *Wizard of Oz* Sunday evening. I sat with Pastor Keith Falk and his wife. I also sat behind some of our illustrious youth. As usual, the youth behaved themselves very well. So did the adults. The actors did a good job. I thought the directors did some typecasting, which I thoroughly enjoyed.

LITURGY

People sometimes ask me to read a Mass for their intentions or to recite Mass for their intentions. This way of speaking flows out of the way we did Mass before the Second Vatican Council.

Then we had solemn high, high (or sung) and read Masses depending on how many ministers and how much singing we used. In those days, the people did not seem to have such an active role in Mass as we do now, and it seemed that the priest did all the work, often silently. In sung Masses, the choir or organist did most of the congregational singing and the servers did most of the responses to the priest. The people often prayed the rosary or did other devotional prayers until they learned how to pray along with the priest by using missals with English translations of the priest's Latin. The terms reading and reciting Mass harken back to this time and emphasize the predominant role of the priest.

Since the Second Vatican Council, however, we have grown to understand the vital role of the people at Mass. Now we emphasize the role of the priest as celebrating Mass with the people. Now, we usually speak of the priest as celebrating Mass, or saying, Mass. The priest's role as leader, however, does not make him a conductor of Mass or a performer of Mass; he leads the celebration. If you ask me to say Mass for you, I may say, "Mass", and quip that I already have said it. For such a smart-alecky remark, you would then have to forgive me.

This Year's Projects

Project #1: A wind storm tore the porch roof off of Daisy Banke's trailer. Daisy is an elderly woman who lives alone. She also needs some rails and steps so she can move safely in and out of the trailer.

Estimated Cost: \$800.00 for lumber and roofing.

Project #2: Loretta Thornsberg lives in a trailer with five young children. Her porch roof leaks. There are no steps out of her back door. **Estimated Cost \$300.00 for lumber and roof patching.**

Project #3: Mary Wagner has trouble walking. She has no way to get in and out of her trailer. We will need to build some type of porch with a ramp. **Estimated Cost: \$650.00 for lumber and supplies.**

Project #4: Kelly Barnett is a single parent with two children who are 2 and 4 years old. She needs a small deck with a ramp out of the front of her trailer. Her back door leaks and it is causing damage to the floor.

Estimated Cost: \$550.00 for lumber and supplies to repair the door leak.

Project #5: Sandy Hook Center run by Christian Social Services needs shelving for supplies and a window put in one of the rooms if possible.

Estimated Cost: \$800.00 for shelving and window.

Other Costs: Gas: \$660.00 Food: \$200.00
