FATHER DAVE

I found out that I had an interesting column last week. I had written it the Friday before the previous Sunday to meet an early deadline imposed by the impending holiday the week later. Naturally, I proceeded to write it as if for the last Sunday of June instead of for the first Sunday of July. This week, I think I have returned to normal (by my definition, not by my sisters' definition) and can think in terms of July 13, next Sunday. Such trials and experiences we have as we go through life.

LITURGY

In a discussion with some of the Men's Group in the parish last week, we spoke of St Paul. One article used the term Pauline Christianity. The more I have thought about this, the more I have come to think in terms of Paul's Judaism.

Paul puts forth the idea in his writings that those who believe in Christ make up the true Jewish people. He speaks of pagan converts as grafted onto the natural vine of Israel (Romans 11:11-15). He speaks of the Gentiles as once strangers now made into members of Christ (Colossians 1:21; Ephesians 2:11-20). He declares that Christ has abolished the distinction between Jew and Gentile, slave and free by making all people one in himself (Galatians 3:28; Colossians 3:11)

Paul did not give up his Jewishness in following Christ. He saw his life as a disciple of Christ the fulfillment of his Jewish calling. He boastfully calls himself a Hebrew, an Israelite and a descendant of Abraham (2 Corinthians 11:22-23; Philippians 3:4-10). In Romans 9:3, Paul declares that he would accept condemnation for himself if this would save his brother Israelites.

Paul saw his vocation as one of bringing Gentiles and native Jews together in the true Israel, not in terms of his own brand of Christianity.


ANNUAL FARM MASS
