FATHER DAVE

In last week's homily, I wanted to emphasize the role of the Holy Spirit as the One who understands our language and translates it into God's language. I likened it to a different gift, the gift of tongues, noting that this gift sometimes scares people. Both gifts have a basis in Sacred Scripture. The gift of which I spoke we all have; the gift of tongues, we do not all have. The gift of which I spoke has the greater importance, whereas the gift of tongues Paul puts towards the bottom of the list of gifts (1 Corinthians 14:1-25).

All the gifts of the Holy Spirit come to us, not for our own fame, but for the good of the Church. If God gives you a gift, use it.

LITURGY

Why do more people come on Thursdays when we have exposition than on days when we do not have exposition; we have the same Lord present in both instances? The reason lies in this, that exposition, with its eventual benediction, constitutes a liturgical act. The Lord's presence in the tabernacle invites private, not liturgical, prayer. For liturgical rites, we have to have people present; without people we have to cancel liturgical rites. This helps explain why we have to put the eucharist back in the tabernacle if we have no one in church during exposition. The Church does not leave the eucharist unattended, except in the tabernacle. We train communion distributors to consume extra hosts so that they do not leave them unattended in church or in other places.
