FATHER DAVE

A year makes up one fifth of a child of five years and time seems to crawl for the youngster. A year makes up 1.4 percent of my life, so time seems to fly. Only yesterday, we celebrated Easter and this month we face the start of new school year. The projects of summer will soon give way to other things.

Has time caught you? We always seem to need teachers for our religious education programs. Since God has made parents the primary teachers of their children in the ways of faith, we always come to you parents and ask you to help us teach your children.

Many parents claim not to know their faith enough to teach. We provide training courses, book with notes for teachers and other things to help you present the faith to your children. I ask you to consider helping with our religious education programs this year.

LITURGY and CHAIN LETTERS

The instructions on the Novena to St Jude read, "This Novena Prayer must be said six times each day for nine consecutive days, leaving nine copies in the Church each day. Your prayer will be answered on or before the ninth day and this has never been known to fail. . . . Make 81 copies and leave nine copies for nine consecutive days. You will receive your intention/request before the nine days are over, no matter how impossible it may seem."

These promises and the specific directions make prayers and novenas of this sort works of superstition because they promise results simply from doing certain things. They fall into the same classification as throwing salt over one's shoulder, carrying a rabbit's foot or anything else done for good luck. Good private devotions help us open up to God's grace in our lives; they do not force God's hand, as this novena seems to do.
