FATHER DAVE

We left the Cincinnati airport for Assisi Wednesday. Our route took us to Detroit where he boarded a KLM flight to Rome through Amsterdam. After customs, we went by bus to Assisi. Friday, we followed the footsteps of St Francis to the basilica, which houses his body and walked through Assisi for places that Francis knew. Today we shall go to the Basilica of St Mary of the Angels, which houses the Porziuncula Church. Here Francis met Clare and welcomed her into the movement. Here also Francis died. The Porziuncula measures approximately 24 by 50 feet. Today the basilica completely encompasses the church. The Porziuncula serves as the founding place for the three Franciscan orders the Friar Minor, the Poor Clares and the Third order, both religious and secular.

LITURGY

Father Mick spoke of transubstantiation in the liturgical catechesis we had last Sunday. He gave me the best definition of body that I have heard. Our body serves as the only means we have to communicate with others. Without a body, our soul could not communicate. In the days before his sacred resurrection, Christ communicated with us through a physical body, like our own, one made with corpuscles. After his resurrection, he communicates with us through the Church and in a special way, through the Eucharist. Through the Eucharist, Christ really makes himself present to us and communicates with us. He can do this because under the appearances of bread and wine, he has made his body and blood present among us. He does this in reality, not just in symbol. He said, "This is my body; this is my blood". He did not say that the bread and wine looked like his body and blood or merely represented his body and blood. He said, "This is my body and this is my blood." We take Jesus at his word and believe that the bread and wine change into the body and blood of Christ. We call this change transubstantiation because the substance, the underlying reality of bread and wine change into the substance, the underlying reality of the body and blood of Christ. Incidentally, the Lutheran theology of the Eucharist comes closer to ours than to any other Protestant belief.
