FATHER DAVE

To go on pilgrimage means to undertake a journey with some peril. Pilgrims go without pride and power to a place which God has blessed by his presence or the presence of those who made God manifest, by the holiness of their lives. To go on pilgrimage means to open a space where we can meet God. To go on pilgrimage means to walk on holy ground and to realize that wherever we tread, we tread on holy ground.

I went in the footsteps of St Francis and St Clare. I walked also in the footsteps of St Rufinus, a fourth century bishop of Assisi and St Sabinus, fourth-century bishop of neighboring Spoleto. I also met the early followers of Francis, such as Blessed Guy of Assisi. All these remind me that we walk on holy ground here in Frenchtown and Versailles. To come back means to have learned that we live our whole life on pilgrimage to the holiness of God.

Tomorrow we celebrate the feast of the holy archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. Before the reform of the calendar forty years ago, we celebrated each of these on different day, Gabriel on March 24 and Raphael on October 24. Now we celebrate the three together on the anniversary of the dedication of the Basilica of St Michael in Rome.

On October 2, we celebrate the memory of the Angels Guardian, those who contemplate the face of God and have a mission from God to help and counsel us by their real, but invisible, presence.
