**FATHER DAVE**

I apologize. I should have reminded a certain organization not to put leaflets on the cars during Mass last week. I had previously asked them not to and thought they would honor my request. I have asked them not to continue this action. I do not think we need groups telling us how to vote. I have tried my best to give you information from the official spokesmen of the Church, our bishops. I read the bishops' statement as saying that you can conscientiously vote for any candidate, provided you do not vote for those who hold positions contrary to the Church's teaching in order to advocate these positions. We do not live in a perfect world, but we do live in a world marked by God's blessings. I think that no matter which candidate wins the election, he will bring some blessings to the world, but his opponents could have brought different ones. In like manner, the one elected will probably bring some ills into the world, whereas his opponents would have brought other ills in the world. I want you to vote Tuesday as well as you can.

**LITURGY**

The reforms made in the liturgy after the Second Vatican seeks to enhance the celebration of Sunday. The Council calls Sunday the primordial feast along with Easter. Only solemnities and feasts of the Lord in the universal calendar can take the place of a Sunday celebration. The Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed on November 2 has this importance. So does the anniversary of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, the Cathedral of the Church at Rome. The Church considers the Pope's cathedral the mother church of the Christian world. We celebrate this feast next Sunday.
