FATHER DAVE

My Dad's name lives on. My nephew named his firstborn son Vincent Nazaire. My grandparents named Dad after a martyr beheaded by Diocletian in Milan. The people of France seem to have a great devotion to him. Now, a hundred years after Dad's birth, there arises another to carry on the name. I think grandma and all the great-uncles and great-aunts approve of the naming of the child.

LITURGY

The unbaptized catechumen and the baptized Christian have different rights. The catechumen has a right to share in the Word of God, but not to share in the eucharist until baptized. The baptized Christian has a right to confirmation and to the eucharist as well as to the table of the Word of God.

The Church has two main paths leading to confirmation and eucharist for those baptized. Those baptized Catholic as infants follow one path and receive confirmation usually as teenagers and communion at the age of seven. Those above the age of reason who have received baptism in other denominations follow a different path and receive confirmation and eucharist when they make their profession of faith in the Catholic Church.

Unbaptized children of catechetical age seeking entry into the Catholic Church enter a period of formation in the catechumenate and receive baptism, confirmation and the eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

Thanks to all who worked on the program to commemorate the Faithful Departed last Sunday.

I learned a method of dealing with grief that has helped many people. The program addresses the emotional issues of loss and grief. Instead of focusing on the brain, it focuses on the heart, where the grieving person has a big "ouch". The program follows the outline given in *The Grief Recovery Handbook* authored by John W. James and Russell Friedman. The definition of grief that I used in my homily last Sunday came from these authors. I called grief "the conflicting feelings caused by the end of or change in a familiar pattern of behavior." I found it on page 3 of my copy of the book. I have about twenty copies of the book available.
