A thousand letters will translate into a thousand marks in favor of a proposal or opposed to it. The officials pay attention to the total tally of mail received. Go for it, and God bless each and everyone of you.

LITURGY

Next Sunday, we switch to Mark's gospel. Although our cycles of readings from the three gospels follows their traditional order, Matthew, Mark and Luke, scholars generally consider Mark as the earliest of the gospels, possibly written in Rome in the 60's. Matthew and Luke seem to follow Mark's basic outline in writing their gospels. Each gospel has its own character; Mark wants us to identify Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God. Mark's gospel has about 1000 verses less than Matthew's and Luke's. Mark does not have Jesus telling many stories; he gives no long discourses. He does show the power of Jesus' teaching and healing.
