FATHER DAVE

Our national holiday of thanksgiving does not compare with our Christian holiday of thanksgiving. Our national holiday occurs once a year and rejoices in football and parades. Our Christian holyday of thanksgiving rejoices in the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. It also comes once a week in a big way and once daily in an alluring way. When we celebrate Mass, we celebrate the Eucharist, which, as you know, means thanksgiving in Greek. Celebrate Thanksgiving Day as a national holiday, but celebrate with our Christian Thanksgiving Feast, the Eucharist.

I give thanks to my God for you, for your faithfulness despite difficulties. I give thanks for my family, both the old and the young. God bless you all.
