FATHER DAVE

This past year, we welcomed 50 people into the Church through baptism at St Denis and two at Holy Family. Eight received the sacrament of confirmation at Holy Family and 56 at St Denis. Thirty-six received communion for the first time at St Denis and ten at Holy Family. Six couples entered holy matrimony at St Denis. We buried twelve people from St Denis parish and six from Holy Family. Besides, Holy Family has had five parishioners die since October 1, 2008. These numbers reflect nine who entered the Church or completed their initiation into the Church in the RCIA program.

LITURGY

Epiphany celebrates the manifestation of the Lord. It celebrates the adoration of the magi and the baptism of the Lord Jesus. It also celebrates the manifestation of the Lord, traditionally at the wedding at Cana in Galilee. We celebrate this third manifestation on the Sunday after the Baptism in Cycle C. When we use the readings from cycles A and B on this Sunday, we celebrate how John the Baptist pointed Jesus out to the crowds and his disciples.

The Third Sunday of Ordinary Times, next week, continues the theme of manifestation. This year we shall hear the early preaching of Jesus and his call of the first disciples from Mark's gospel.
