LITURGY AND LENT

Thanks for the palm.

Join us in the liturgy of Lent. Fasting and abstaining reflect our membership in the body of Christ, his Church. They mean nothing unless they reflect our inner turning from sin towards Christ. They tell others that we take the Word of God seriously and encourage others to listen to the voice of the Lord calling them to a deeper conversion.

Participating in our daily communion liturgies at 6:30 on school days proclaim that we have the same faith of the Church in the presence of Christ in the eucharist. It proclaims that we do not live on bread alone, but that we need the Word of God as well.

Lent ends on Holy Thursday evening at supper. Then we start the Easter Triduum. Lent empties into the Triduum as a river empties into the sea. The Triduum serves as a retreat leading to the Easter Vigil when we baptize the elect and celebrate the anniversary of our baptism.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Fast days (between the ages of 18 and 59) less food and no meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (also recommended for Holy Saturday).

Abstinence from meat (14 and over) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and all Fridays (also recommended for Holy Saturday). On Fridays during the year, but not during Lent, we may substitute works of charity for abstinence. The obligation does allow some leeway. If your host serves you meat, eat it. If you order meat by mistake, eat it.

We fast and abstain in solidarity with the Church and those called to baptism at the Easter Vigil. When we fast, others should feast. If our penance causes others to do penance or have a hard time, we should change our penance.
