FATHER DAVE

I have found it difficult to give homilies based on the second readings, usually from St Paul. Nevertheless, I have done so and I have learned from it. I intend to use the second reading as the basis for the homily until July of 2011 so as to complete a threeyear cycle of readings. I shall leave Monday for a four-day seminar on preaching at the Athenaeum of Ohio. This should give me some new insights into preaching the homily.

LITURGY

Easter has ended and the feasts of the Holy Trinity and the Body and Blood of Christ have passed. Now we revert to something called Ordinary Time. Ordinary here does not mean boring, dull or routine; it means something derived from ordinal numerals, the forms of numbers we use to rank things, such as first place and second place. It refers to the weeks outside the times of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter that we rank as one of the thirty-three or thirty-four weeks that lie outside these seasons. Today marks the twelfth Sunday of the year, after having excluded the seasonal Sundays, so we call it the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the time marked by ordinal numerals.


DEACON JACK
