FATHER DAVE

What a flood of creativity I experienced last week at the conference on preaching! We heard talks on the theology and the mechanics of the homily and did a practice homily. One homilist assumed the voice of the woman with hemorrhage to explain the message of the gospel. In this way, he included many who feel left out of church, those in broken families or broken lives, gays, people who have had abortions, those with contagious diseases and other untouchables in our society. Somehow, the homily has to reach out to all peoples and include the one preaching as well.

LITURGY AND THE HOMILY

Sermons tend to prove points of doctrine and homilies explain the sacred scriptures. Prior to the Second Vatican Council, preaching sermons, formed a minor interruption in the liturgy; they often started and ended with the sign of the cross. Since Vatican Council, preaching, in the form of the homily, forms an integral part of the liturgy and does not start or end with the sign of the cross. Before the Council, the sermon had little, if any, relation to the Mass. Since the Council, the homily has a strong liturgical function. Sermons have an abstract and formal structure; homilies have a more popular and conversational style.

In a related matter, eulogies praise people for what they have done for God while homilies praise God for what he has done for people. Homilies, especially at funerals, should not take the form of a eulogy. Reference to people and the good they have done has to show the action of God in their lives and our lives.


