LITURGY: SEVEN WEEK WITH EPHESIANS

Most good scholars today believe that St Paul did not write the letter, but that it comes to us with his apostolic authority.

Good theology leads to good morals. A good moral life reflects a sound understanding of God and our relationship with God and others. I look forward to the letter to the Ephesians.


