LITURGY AND PETITIONS (1 of 2)

The Liturgy of the Word takes place at the ambo, or pulpit for the most part. The priest presides over this portion for the liturgy from the chair just as he presides over the Liturgy of the Eucharist from the altar. He may give the homily standing at his chair because the Church considers the homily a presidential function, not a ministerial one. The readings and petitions take place at the ambo, or pulpit, because normally people other than the presiding priest do these. The Verse before the Gospel does not take place at the ambo because the deacon or priest will soon occupy the ambo for the gospel. The Petitions normally take place at the ambo because the petitions flow out of the texts proclaimed.
