LITURGY

I talked about welcoming in last week's bulletin, then extolled the symbolism of marriage as a sign of Christ's union with his Church in the homily. I wonder what a divorced person experienced upon hearing the theology of marriage extolled? I think that divorced people have a strong sense of having failed in their primary vocation. How could I have made them feel at home?

If I could answer this question, you could probably consider me a genius. I do not think that divorced people have failed. The Church's process of annulment probes the validity of the marriage, not the partners of the marriage. If the Church declares a marriage null and void, the Church does so to address pastoral concerns with the people involved. The Church always presumes the validity of marriages and does not try to prove that one or other members of the marriage tried to ambush the marriage. The process puts the marriage on trial, not the partners to the marriage. If a marriage lacks validity, it does so because of serious flaws in the marriage from the start, not from one or both parties later. The Church wants to welcome both parties in a marriage case and not take sides.

Marriage does resemble the love of Christ and his Church for each other. Even valid sacramental marriages that have ended in divorce do this because of this fundamental similarity with the union of Christ and his Church.

On the other hand, nowhere do we say that only non-sinners or perfect saints have a place in Church. We all have sinned and we all need conversion from sin to Christ. We do not achieve this outside of the Church. Only in the Church, in union with other sinners, do we achieve perfection. I hope I do better this week.
