FATHER DAVE

My favorite sister from Tucson came to visit earlier this month. She came with my five favorite sisters from Ohio for supper before she left. We had a grand time. I shared with them the results of my genealogical investigations in August. Another brought copies of the biographies she had written on each of us forty years ago. We traded information and made copies of on the copier. Each left a little richer and I went to bed feeling enormously wealthy in family heritage. The next day I wrote my two favorite brothers from other states and my favorite sister from California. If you wonder about my unfavorite siblings, I seldom, if ever, mention them.

LITURGY: THE SICK AND THE DYING

How does the Sacrament of the Sick differ from the Last Rites? The Church offers the sacrament of the sick to those seriously sick, sick enough that death could result. The Church offers the last rites to those about to die. The sacrament of the sick consecrates a person into a special sharing in the sufferings of Christ during the course of a serious illness. The Church does not repeat this sacrament unless a different serious illness should present itself.

The sacrament of the sick consists of these ceremonies: the sacrament of penance, the anointing of the sick and the giving of communion. A seriously sick person should receive this sacrament of the sick at the first signs of serious illness, not at the end of the illness. The sacrament embraces the hope of healing and restoration to the family, not primarily to death.

I shall continue this with a treatment of the last rites next week.


