#### **FATHER DAVE**

I have heard that when people go back five or six generations, they find themselves related to several thousand or hundreds of thousand people. My column last week prompted a letter from a possible relative in Kentucky.

The Sublers originally spelled their name Sabourin, which seems very close to Soubiran. In Paris, in the year 1889, Blessed Marie Therese de Soubiran died. She had founded the Society of Mary our Help. I wonder if she and the Sublers share a common ancestor (besides Adam and Eve). How many more of us have saints in our genealogies?

#### LITURGY: LAST RITES

I wrote last week about the sacrament for the sick, a sacrament for those seriously sick which they should receive at the start of the illness. This week, I write about the Last Rites.

The Last Rites include the sacrament of penance, which a person ought to receive before death, the Apostolic Blessing, given by the priest in the name of the Pope, a profession of faith and communion as Viaticum, with a special formula. The sacrament of the sick does not form a part of the Last Rites unless the person has not yet received the sacrament, which can happen at an accident. When I receive a call for the Last Rites, I presume the person has already received the sacrament of the sick and has the ability to swallow the eucharist. When I arrive and find the person almost dead and unable to swallow, I wish to myself that the family had called me sooner so that its loved one could have used the last rites better to prepare for death.


