GETTING MARRIED?

Someone asked why Catholics must marry "in the Church" for a valid marriage. All cultures and civilizations put controls on the exercise of sexuality because the existence of the group depends on it. Without controls, the basic instinct of the sexual drive could destroy the community. The general culture of the United States has a stance on sexuality that seems to allow almost any expression; the Catholic Church sees this as dangerous for society and for faith in God. Society does not want restraints, but the Church sees that God has intended restraints and controls. The Church's teaching on marriage and sexuality reflects this belief in God and the order he intended in creating us sexual.

FATHER DAVID VINCENT'S COLUMN

I applaud those young people among us who use their new envelopes. I have heard that some have asked why we have made this change. The change came with the advice and support of the Financial Committee and the Pastoral Council. We made this decision so that we could teach our young people about Christian stewardship and train them in practical support of the Church. Without their support, in prayer, time and finances, our parishes will not survive the deaths of their parents.

LITURGY: PASTOR RESCINDS DECISION, RESTORES PRE-CUT ALTAR BREADS

Father Vincent announced this past week that he would restore the pre-cut host. He said that he has switched to the larger host to show greater unity among us. He said that the gesture of breaking bread together symbolically helps people grow together. He wanted to use the larger hosts to bring us together. He has decided that this gesture has backfired and that people only saw desecration of the Eucharist because so many people seem to have picked up from the floor fragments of the consecrated Body of Christ. He saw that what should draw us together seemed to draws us apart.

He tried to combine the gesture of unity with reverence for the Eucharist. He decided that he had failed and could not provide for the reverence due the real presence of the Lord under the form of bread in the present circumstances. He has therefore decided to revert to the pre-cut altar breads. He has notified our supplier accordingly.

He also apologizes for any confusion. He has also said that he will instruct the communion distributors to move the communion plates toward the recipients to catch any fragments that might fall. He hopes that this clears up any confusion, restores proper order and maintains the proper respect for the Eucharist demanded in our official liturgical books and directives.
