It goes back to the first years of European settlements here, but it comes from a people that tended to look upon the natives as less than human and Catholics with disdain, so much so that Catholics did not live in Boston until after the Revolutionary War.

I also have mixed feelings because we do Thanksgiving every time we celebrate the Eucharist, not once a year.

Use the booklet *Five Minutes with the Word* from the back of church. Investigate the Advent wreath and the Jesse Tree. Read the prophet Isaiah. Christmas lasts from December 25 to January 10.


REGIONAL PENANCE SERVICE
