FATHER DAVID VINCENT'S COLUMN

A new year has come. The old year had its hopes and trials, but God has blessed us this past year. He will continue to do this in this year as we end the first decade of the twenty-first century. All times and seasons belong to the Lord our God who sits upon his throne in glory. He sits, because he has everything under his control and does not have to worry about the outcome. We can sit with him in faith and hope, because in him, we have received the fullest of God's blessings in Christ who revealed himself through a star, at the Jordan in his baptism and at the wedding feast of Cana, changing water into wine.

LITURGY: EPIPHANY

The Eastern Churches celebrate Epiphany primarily as the baptism of the Lord. Originally, they ranked it on a par with Easter and Pentecost. It also celebrates to a lesser degree the coming of the Magi and the wedding feast at Cana. In each of these, they see the glory of the Lord made manifest.

We of the Western Church likewise celebrate these three mysteries. We celebrate the manifestation to the Magi today and we celebrate the baptism next Sunday. We celebrate the wedding at Cana on the Second Sunday on ordinary Time.

Our Catholic brothers and sisters in the Eastern Churches celebrate the Epiphany with greater importance than Christmas.
