LITURGY: EPIPHANY

The events of the Epiphany continue to unfold this week and next eve though we shall have officially left the Christmas-Epiphany even today. Historically the West has celebrated the Baptism of the Lord Jesus and the Wedding Feast as two of the three parts of the mystery of Epiphany. Today, we celebrate the Baptism. Next week we shall celebrate the wedding at Cana.

Tomorrow we enter the time of year ordered by weeks and Sundays using ordinal numbers. This practice of counting first, second, third up to thirty-fourth gives this time its English title, Ordinary Time. We ought not expect, however, to find this Ordinary Time ordinary or boring. Rather, we take up the theme of the whole life of the Lord. This year in this extraordinary time called Ordinary Time, we shall have the gospel according to Luke proclaimed with readings from 1 and 2 Corinthians, Colossians, 2 Thessalonians, 1 Timothy and Hebrews.
