FATHER DAVID VINCENT'S COLUMN

Wow! Wow! WOW! What a response on such short notice. You gave almost twelve thousand dollars for the relief of the people in Haiti. I call this very impressive. I certainly commend you in your generosity. We have forwarded this money to Cincinnati for the Archbishop to disburse for relief in Haiti. If you did not give last week, you may do so today.

LITURGY: NEW CHANGES

We expect changes in the liturgy will take effect in the spring or fall of 2011. Does our current translation have mistakes in it? Yes and no. I have to give the same answer to the new translation. Both the current text and the new text try to express in English the meaning of words that come to us from an ancient language and from the Bible. No translation can fully represent these concepts without overburdening the English language and our ability to comprehend.

It will introduce us again to the concept of consubstantial. We currently use *one in being* for this concept. Consubstantial means *of the same substance* or *sharing the same substance*. It translates the Greek term that means *of the same beingness*. All these terms try to explain the philosophical and theological concept of substance. Substance means the essential quality of a thing, that which makes thing itself. The substance of bread differs from its qualities of taste, texture, color and shape. We say that the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit have the same substance and we call them consubstantial. They differ in how they relate to each other as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. When we say that we have only one God, we express substance. When we say in three divine persons, we say that all three share the same substance, but differ in how they relate to each other.
