BLESSED CANDLES

Every year of February 2, we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. We also call it Candlemas Day. We usually bless candles for liturgical use then. We put some blessed candles at the main exit; you may take some home with you.

FATHER DAVID VINCENT'S COLUMN

Canon Law binds both pastor and parents to prepare children to receive first communion as early as possible after the children have attained the use of reason (canon 914). Which we presume they have by their seventh birthday. This forms the basis for the pastor's policy of not having one set day for the celebration of the first communion. When parents have their children ready, they should schedule first communion.

LITURGY: MARY, MOTHER OF GOD

We host a replica of the tilma of St Juan Diego Thursday. The tilma, a peasant's cloak, exhibits an image of the Virgin Mary, clothed like an Aztec divine figure, pregnant with her Child. Mary appeared to St Juan Diego in 1531 and Juan Diego came to know her as the mother of his people. In her, the native Americans came to know the compassion of God. We celebrate Mary under the title of Our lady of Guadalupe as the patroness of the Americas. Every native American struggling against poverty and oppression see her as their patroness. Every Latino trying to cross our borders to free his family from poverty looks to the Virgin of Guadalupe for help.

We host this image Thursday from before Mass to 5:00. I encourage you to come and honor Mary under this title. Throughout the day, we shall have prayers, some liturgical, others private. In your prayers, please remember all the oppressed peoples of this hemisphere. Oppressed people suffer from economic hardship, unemployment, homelessness, lack of shelter from storms and earthquake. Some suffer from sexual exploitation and abortion. These oppressions affect more our sisters and brothers of native and Catholic descent in Central and South America and in the Caribbean.
