FATHER DAVID VINCENT'S COLUMN

I think you did well last weekend. I halfway expected low numbers in church, but I saw a good number of you present. I rejoiced that so many of you could get out for Mass. I missed the others, but knew that they could not make it.

LITURGY: THE OBLIGATION FOR SUNDAY MASS

We have heavy snows last weekend. We also had hazardous driving conditions. If you missed Mass last week because of the weather or because of sickness, then you did not sin. The obligation to participate in Mass binds seriously but not absolutely. A serious obligation demands a serious reason to cancel the obligation. We never have an obligation to do the impossible; impossibility cancels the obligation. Bad weather, like sickness, can cancel the obligation of participating in Mass.

Some people have feelings of guilt when they miss Mass through no fault of their own. Feelings of guilt describe disappointment. Rather than indicating guilt, they really indicate depth of faith. Feelings of guilt do not equal guilt. Feelings of guilt do not make up the subject matter of the sacrament of penance; only sins do.

SIN. PENANCE AND LENT

During Lent, we focus our attention on baptism and repentance. For the catechumen, the unbaptized person, Lent means preparing for the sacraments of initiation, baptism, confirmation and Eucharist. For us baptized, it means preparing to celebrate the Easter Mystery with minds and hearts renewed because we have turned from sin and returned to penance.

In this spirit of Lent, I shall offer this year a four-part series on Sin and Penance. I hope to explore sin, its existence, meaning and presence in our lives, kinds of sin. It will include a short course on how to sin, complete with samples. It will explore the Sacrament of Penance with a brief historical overview, the practice of the sacrament prior to the Second Vatican Council and the current rites of penance.

I hope that you will mark these dates in your calendar for Lent:

- Thursday, February 25, 7:00 in the church at St Denis: Sin (Presentation)
- Thursday, March 4, 7:00 in the church at St Denis: Sin and Historical Overview of Penance (Presentation)
- Thursday, March 11, 7:00 in the church at St Denis: Rites of Penance (Presentation)
- Thursday, March 18, 7:00 in the church at St Denis: Penance Service with many priests (Sacrament)

LENT

Lent calls us to discipline. It calls us to give up sin and turn back to the gospel. It brings us into the desert, shows us the glory of our transfigured selves with Christ and leads us to the water of life, the light of Christ and the new life of faith and baptism. The first discipline of Lent comes from within us; the second shows itself by our outward behavior.

First, we turn away from sin and return to the gospel. Second, we show this by joining the community of the Church in outward penance, fasting and abstaining.

Fasting from food binds all between the ages of 18 and 59. We fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting refers to the amount of food we eat. When we fast we eat less food.

Abstaining from meat binds all over the age of 14. Abstinence refers to the kind of food we eat. When we abstain, we give up eating meat, but not fish or eggs. In the United States, abstinence binds on the Fridays of Lent, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting and abstaining do allow of some exceptions. If you eat in a place that only serves meat, you may eat it. If you order meat and then remember, you may eat it. You should not embarrass your host at a meal. If you get crabby from not eating, you probably would do better to eat and exercise good charity towards others.

WEATHER AND SCHOOL CLOSINGS

When the schools close because of weather (excepting fog), we automatically close the church buildings to all meetings and conferences except Mass and the Sacrament of Penance (one-on-one).

Need exists in the community and, as we all have witnessed over the past year, that need is growing, be it financial, social, or spiritual. The experience in the agency's food pantry this year tells us more people lack the ability to buy food and pay their utilities and rent. For many, medical costs are beyond their reach. An increasing number of people in our community are working but not earning enough to survive without help. Over the past 15 months, our agency has stretched to provide emergency food assistance to help a growing number of needy families — we have seen the need grow by 38% in the last year. To meet the growing needs of the poor, we must count on goodwill that is extended throughout the year.

Facts about the GROWING need:

- Last year on an average morning at the Catholic Social Services of the Miami Valley Food Pantry, 40-50 families received food assistance; in the past few months we have seen this number increase to more than 60 families.
- A full 25% of those we serve every month are first-time visitors to the Food Pantry.
- In one recent month, we provided emergency food assistance to more than 3,500 men, women, and children.
- Over 70% of the food assistance provided is distributed to children and senior citizens.
