FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN:

I enjoyed myself at my sister's celebration. She gave a short acceptance speech and spoke more about the other members of the Professional Women's Network and her family than she did about herself.

We toured the Monterey Aquarium, one of the best in the nation, visited Pebble Beach as a guest of one of the residents and ate at the Mission Ranch in Carmel, where we saw the owner and some spoke with him, Clint Eastwood. We also visited my sister's Toastmasters' Club, where she serves as president.

Besides that, we had the adventure of flying, both in the air and on the ground between flights. We also had express delivery of our luggage to my sister's home on Wednesday.

LITURGY AND LITURGICAL OFFICES

We need more help with the various functions of the Mass. We need more Extraordinary Ministers of Communion, Servers, Lectors, Ushers and Greeters, Musicians and Gift Bearers. Please respond by this Wednesday so that we can process your application and train you.

All these offices flow from our baptism. All of them come from the congregation and serve the congregation and the assembly of God's people. While we need more officers to fill these specialized functions, we need more people to make up the assembly. We have less than half of our registered members celebrating the Liturgy with us each weekend. All of the baptized make up the most important group in the Liturgy, that of the assembly or people present for Mass.

PARISH STEWARDSHIP INITIATIVE

Our reports on the Stewardship Initiative run about a week late. We have received over 350 responses. I consider this a good response. Please respond this week so that we do not have to send you letters reminding you to reply.

The following tally sheet reports for the week ending October 31. I think you have done well.

For St Denis, families promised increases in their donations, pledging \$1262.50, an average of \$9.35 per week. Another 57 responded that they could not at this time promise an increase. For Holy Family, 21 families pledged increases, a total of \$178.73, an average of \$8.51 per family. Another 19 said that they could not pledge an increase at this time.

A good number have asked about electronic giving. Some replied that they do not use envelopes. Others see envelopes as a way of gift-wrapping their present.


We ask that you return the commitment card even if you have decided not to increase your offering. Returning the envelope or card tells us that you have taken part in the program and saves us money.
