FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN:

I want to thank all of you for your support of the Stewardship Initiative. You have raised our collections twenty-five percent. I apologize to those who received letter upon letter even after they had responded. Sometimes, we did not associate a reply with the initiative, much to your chagrin and my embarrassment.

This year we host the annual ecumenical Thanksgiving service at St Denis on Tuesday. Because many people travel or have other plans on the Wednesday before Thanksgiving, the ministerial association decided to move the service to Tuesday. Please come and bring your friends.

LITURGY

Today we say goodbye to the Gospel according to Luke and start Cycle A, which focuses on Matthew. We shall resume Luke in 2013.

Matthew pictures Jesus as the new Moses. He divides his account in such a way as to present the life of Jesus in five phases, corresponding to the five books of Moses.

The celebration of Christ the King leads into the celebration of Advent, and the celebration of Advent continues the celebration of Christ the King. In today's gospel, Jesus enters into his kingdom. In next Sunday's gospel, Christ speaks about his coming to call us into his kingdom.

PARISH STEWARDSHIP INITIATIVE

Our reports on the Stewardship Initiative run about a week late. We have received over 390 responses. I consider this a good response.

The following tally sheet reports for the week ending November 7. I think you have done well.

For St Denis, families promised increases in their donations, pledging \$1521.50, an average of \$8.90 per week. Another 78 responded that they could not at this time promise an increase. For Holy Family, 21 families pledged increases, a total of \$212.13, an average of \$7.58 per family. Another 21 said that they could not pledge an increase at this time.

A good number have asked about electronic giving. Some replied that they do not use envelopes. Others see envelopes as a way of gift-wrapping their present.

We ask that you return the commitment card as a sign that you have taken part in the program.
