FATHER DAVID VINCENT'S COLUMN

Yeahhh! Both parishes have now exceeded their goals for this year's CMA and have drawn near to last year's goals. Of the six parishes that have made their goals, we rank second and fifth, all but one in the northern half of the archdiocese.

I encourage those of you who can to come with us to the mass of Christ Tuesday night. We leave by carpool at 3:00; let the office know that you plan to come.

I encourage all of you to celebrate the Easter Vigil with us. The Mass marks the climax of the whole year and celebrates our sharing in the resurrection of the Lord Jesus through our baptism, confirmation and eucharist. The readings focus on baptism and lead us, from the first chapter to Genesis through the Exodus to the waters of baptism.

LITURGY: LENT AND THE TRIDUUM

It takes three days (the meaning of Triduum) to celebrate ritually the mysteries of the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus. The Mass of the Lord's supper celebrates the gift of the Eucharist, the ordained priesthood and the command to love one another. Good Friday commemorates the saving wood of the cross, the Passion and Holy Communion. The Vigil celebrates our sacramental sharing in the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. Easter Sunday celebrates the empty tomb since death cannot hold the Lord nor us, who have received baptism into his saving mysteries.
