# **FATHER DAVID VINCENT'S COLUMN**

When the Second Vatican met, as its first order of business, it undertook the reform of the liturgy, both Mass and the Divine Office. The Council saw the Office as the prayer of the whole people. Prior to this, the priests prayed the Office in the name of the people. From this time on, the Council wanted the people to pray the Office in union with the priests.

The Council saw the office as the means of sanctifying the whole day. It changed the title of the Office to reflect this, calling it the Liturgy of the Hours. I have discerned some interest in praying the Liturgy of the Hours by average members of the parishes. I have started work on this and hope to find a suitable time in the next week or so. If you have any thoughts on this, feel free to contact me at the office.

# LITURGY: THE BISHOP

I like St Ignatius of Antioch. He lived between the years of 35 and 107. He died a martyr at Rome. On his way to Rome from Antioch, he wrote several letters to several Churches along his way. He speaks of the bishops role in the diocese, which he also calls church. "The Church in Syria uses God as pastor through me. Only Jesus Christ will rule the Church through the office of the bishop (Letter to the Romans from the Office of Readings for Tuesday of last week)."

Even today, the Bishop of the diocese takes the place of Jesus Christ. Without our bishop, we have lost our connection to Jesus Christ. For this reason, at every celebration of the Eucharist we pray for our bishop. We should, therefore, pray for our bishop because of the responsibility he has over the Church entrusted to his care. A priest who knowingly and willingly omits the bishop's name (or the Pope's name), has gone into schism with the Diocese and, therefore, with the Church.
