LITURGY: SINGING

Singing can help us celebrate. Who does not sing, "Happy Birthday" to a loved one on the birthday? Reciting the words falls flat. People generally sing the birthday song with enthusiasm, sometimes with improvised harmony, all of which adds to the celebration.

Singing can help us celebrate the divine liturgy of the Mass. We should sing, which means that the priest and the musicians must encourage people to sing and even rehearse with them. Nobody in our choirs has graduated from the Most Prestigious Vocal Academy of the World, so nobody in the choir should scare us into silence. In fact, the choir and cantors exist to help the congregation, not replace the congregation.

If inside us we have the dispositions for full, active and conscious participation, then the music will flow. Something historic and wonderful happens at each Mass. The Lord Jesus Christ, the Conqueror of sin and death, comes among us in many ways. We need to shout out to him in the midst of the assembly, in the proclamation of his Word, in the person of the priest and in the forms of bread and wine.



RE: ST DENIS SCHOOL NEWS

Dear Parishioners

I want to thank the Versailles School District for their help in returning the Middle School building to us. The district has left us tables, chairs, desks and other items when it moved. Mr. Vail and the school board have worked very hard with us to see that we have the equipment similar to what we gave them some forty years ago. The district teachers, staff and other personnel have cooperated very much with us in the process of returning the building to us. Both the Church and the School have worked well beyond the legal terms of the lease to help each other.

Now I want to give you information about how we intend to use the school building. I had thought that I had communicated with everybody this use of the St Denis School Building. Judging from the questions I have heard, however, I had not done enough.

I formed a committee on June 6, 2007 to look into the school question. I charged the committee with making a recommendation about the building. The committee would all the resources available to discern the use of the building and make a recommendation to me.

The committee asked John Freytag, the architect of St Denis's two buildings, to do an assessment of the school. On January 3, 2008, Mr. Freytag reported:

The St Denis School building is generally in good condition and functions adequately as a building for religious education. Several of the building's systems and finishes require maintenance and upgrading due to the building's age. The building does not require any improvements to meet the 2007 Ohio Building Code, as long as the building occupancy continues to be for education.

The committee reported that it would cost at least \$60,000 to tear the building down, that we needed a place for CCD, that the Marion Cluster would give its eyeteeth to have a facility such a we have, that we could not find other users, that it would cost about \$100,000 to bring it up to code for any use other than educational. The committee recommended that we keep the building.

What about the experience of the Marion Cluster? The committee consulted people who know about the arrangements with the Marion Local School Board. To use the facilities of Marion Local, the church needs to have hall monitors at all times, the students may not use the restrooms without adequate supervision, the catechists may not leave any religious articles in the classrooms and the church has to pay a fee for each room the church uses each time the church uses it.

We do have a facility of our own. For us to do what the Marion Cluster has to do, the school committee felt would waste a blessing that we have. We can put in prayer spaces, crucifixes and other religious art, papers and displays permanently in our own building. For us to go elsewhere or rent the new building would leave us in a position similar to what we have had in the past, using a facility not our own, carting equipment back and forth week after week in all kinds of weather, needing additional adult help to supervise the hallways and restrooms. The committee decided that such an arrangement would not do for us.

The last several years the Versailles Schools has paid the utilities and given us a lump sum above this. Prior to 2006, we had paid all the utility bills out of the rent given us. From now on, we shall have to pay for the entire upkeep of the building, not only the external building, but also its internal parts. This will cost us more money for the building, but we only have to heat the building for one evening a week. The rest of the times, we can heat at a level of subsistence. It will cost us at least \$30,000 for the building next year in a very conservative estimate.

We can only get by without the building if we have CCD six nights a week, for we need about 35 classrooms for all students in grades 1 through 12. We can accommodate six in the church and maybe squeeze in a seventh. We need the space in the school. On the other hand, school and sports happen every evening except Wednesdays and Sundays.

We know that sooner or later we shall have some major bills with the school. We have a good roof, but we do not know how long it will last. We have asked the architect of the school, and church, the same architect that built the new K-12 school, to do a survey for us of the projected costs St Denis will have for the church building over the next ten years. We have the report on the school, but do not yet have the report on the church building, but when we have it, we shall report this to you. When we have the full financial picture, we shall also ask for your support in meeting our needs.

Why do we not tear the building down and use only the church building for CCD? We have about 500 students in CCD at St Denis. We need the space. We cannot find another place like what we have. It seems more economical to use what we have. It seems like better stewardship of our resources to recycle and not rebuild.

The School Committee had both men and women members, all known for their ability to see issues and discuss openly. It also had a high school student who adequately voiced the concerns of the students. It worked more on consensus than by vote. It strongly recommended that we keep the building. After I had reviewed all the committee's work, I had the results brought to the Pastoral Council, which concurred. After hearing the discussion between the committee and the Pastoral Council, I agreed with them and accepted the recommendation.

We next tackled the CCD schedule for St Denis. The committee narrowed its recommendations to two, one for two evenings and the other for one. I notified the parents of the CCD students and asked for their input. The vast majority favored having all sessions on Wednesday evenings and we settled for the elementary and middle students to have CCD from 6:00 to 7:00 and the junior and senior high students from 7:30 to 8:30.

I attended the dedication of the new school and checked out classrooms, offices and the like. The school district has a good new facility, which you helped build by your taxes and generous spirit. We have good parish facilities because of your generosity and help. For years, we helped the schools by leasing our building to them; now we have our building back and we move into the future.

We have the Facility Assessment Study done by Freytag & Associates Inc available in the parish office for anyone who would like to see it.

I think the conclusion that we keep the school building and use it for CCD as sound decision, backed by facts and supported by committee.
