# **FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN**

The chain slipped off my bicycle, so I walked to the Relay for Life Friday. I missed the opening talk by Bill Schuette, of which I heard great things, and the "dress-up". I think that those who dressed up had such good disguises that they blended into the crowd. I like the creative ideas the people use to foster donations.

I thought about the cancer in our lives: sin causes us more death than cancer does. The therapy of God's grace has saved more lives than chemo or radiation.

Christ has given the Church the sacrament of the sick for people with serious illnesses. Someone who has a serious illness, such as cancer, ought to seek out the sacrament as soon as possible. The sacrament consecrates the person for the length of the illness in a special way to Christ who suffered for us.

#### LITURGY: SACRAMENT OF PENANCE

Sodom and Gomorrah, what so great bad thing did they do? The Lord did not find ten good people in Sodom and Gomorrah. Even though a certain deviant behavior takes its name from one of the towns, nonetheless, this sin did not cause the downfall of the cities. The readings from the Old Testament, which usually reflect on the gospel readings, suggest lack of hospitality as the sin. In the gospel story today, the householder says, "Do not bother me; I do not want to welcome you." In like manner, the people of Sodom had refused to welcome the messengers sent from God.

In the culture of the Sacred Scriptures, the traveler had the right to receive hospitality, the protection of a householder or citizen, who could protect him from the terrors of the night. Not to offer hospitality meant to turn one's back on someone who needed help. The ancients considered this one of the gravest of sins. Because the people of Sodom and Gomorrah refused to offer hospitality, they received condemnation. The gospel story proclaims that God gives hospitality to all and does not turn his back or reject those who come to him. Welcome others as God does, not as the people of Sodom and Gomorrah did.
