FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN

I once asked a young person to give me one good reason why he should get married. I probably should not have asked the question, but I did and he gave me his answer as plain as day, "because," he said, "I think God has called me to marriage." Then he gave me all the things that supported his conclusion. The young man apparently had done his homework by praying to God for guidance and sign.

He gave an excellent reason. Unless God calls us to a certain state, we have no business going there. This holds for marriage, but it also holds for celibacy, the priesthood and the religious life.

I write this because I see many young people in the parish who could find their fulfillment in the priesthood or religious life, if God so calls them. I see many others who could make good spouses and parents, if God so calls them. I hope we all pray that God direct us and send us signs of the callings he has for us.

PARKING LOT AT HOLY FAMILY

I have noticed that a while back someone crashed into one of the reflector poles protecting the new well. I had thought that the person who did this would own up to it. No one has. I think such person ought also to apologize to the parish by reporting to the pastor. I promise not to break "every bone in his body", report him to the sheriff, sue him or do any other negative things to him, but to welcome him graciously.

STEWARDSHIP COMING

Stewardship means using all that we have as gift from God, not as owned by us. In a certain way, we do own things and have the right to use, sell or keep things. In a more fundamental sense, however, all that we have we have received from God.

We usually speak of our things in three categories, time, talent and treasure. The talents we have, we have from God, for us to use and not misuse. The time of our life we have from God, to which we cannot add another second. The possessions we have, land, clothes, money we have from God.

The stewardship program we shall start September 25 will help us enhance our Sunday offerings. We hope that this will put our parishes on a more solid financial foundation so that we can respond to our needs better in the future.

DIRECT DEPOSIT

The Archbishop has encouraged us pastors to promote electronic giving. This includes direct deposit. This enables people to continue to contribute to their parish while on vacation away from home. If can also allow people to make automatic contributions to the parish on a weekly or monthly basis.

Part of me finds electronic banking mystifying. Several companies with which I deal, cash my checks on-line. It has taken me a while to get used to the extra effort to balance my checking account. On the other hand, on-line banking does have some benefits. I think I could easily pay my estimated income tax electronically every month instead of having to write a check every quarter.

I think the parish would benefit financially if parishioners would use direct deposit. Direct deposit would guarantee better the security of contributions made by eliminating the middle handlers of money.

CATECHETICAL AND YOUTH MINISTRY PARKING AT ST DENIS

First Session (6:00-7:00; Grades 1-6)

Catechetical leaders should enter the church lot from Ward Street or from Center Street and park close to the picket fence, the school or the church building.

Parents should enter the church lot from Ward Street or from Center Street close to the picket fence (Northwest Entrance). They should park facing directly east (Second St). They should disregard the lines used for Mass on Sundays. When students leave class at 7:00 p.m., their parents should park in the same area each week if at all possible.

All traffic after CCD exits east to Second Street.

Second Session (7:30-8:30; Grades 7-12)

All should use extra caution as those involved in the first session may still remain on the premises. Remain alert for pedestrian traffic. All should use the Ward Street and Center Street. Catechists and Staff have reserved parking at the fence, church and school building. The rest should park facing east. Drivers should exercise care so as not to block cars still parked from the earlier session. All traffic after CCD exits east to Second Street.

Youth Ministry (6:15 to 7:25).

If driving, students should enter from Center Street (Southwest Entrance), closer to the traffic light than to the fence. They should park in the area immediately west of the school (across from the post office). They should park so as not to block the vehicles of those attending the first session. All traffic will move east to Second Street to exit at the end of CCD.
