FATHER DAVE'S COLUMN:

I leave even before dawn thinks about cracking tomorrow morning. Our flight takes us to Houston and thence to Huatulco. We have a layover of 2 hours and fourteen minutes in Houston. We return Monday the tenth from Huatulco at 2:55 p.m. and arrive in Houston at 5:36. We takeoff from Houston at 7:20 and arrive in Dayton at 10:38.

I had gone to Mexico with a Scout Troop in 1991 and came back with some unspent pesos, 13,800 of them. The present rate of exchange allows 12 pesos to the dollar. This sounds good until we consider that the Mexican government revalued its currency about 17 years ago and the decimal point moved three positions to the left. The old pesos bring about \$1.11 dollars now. I really did not think I had eleven hundred dollars worth of Mexican money lying around.

Keep this trip in your prayers that it bears fruit in the lives of our parishes. The Hispanic culture, a Catholic one, has much to teach us, who live in a largely Protestant culture.

LITURGY:

Our Eastern Catholic sisters and brothers celebrate January 6 the way we do Christmas. An ancient theory thought that the perfect life would start and end on the same date of the calendar. This would mean that the death of Jesus came on the same date as his conception. According to the Western calendar, the crucifixion took place on March 25, the same day as the Annunciation. The Western Church celebrates March 25 as the day of the death of good thief.

Some ancients associated the sixth of April with the death of Jesus. These would tend to celebrate April 6 as the day of conception and January 6 as the day of his birth.

Both methods use arbitrary systems to come to the date of Jesus' birth. Their reasoning comes from their theology of the perfect person's lifespan rather than from historical evidence. This, however, does nothing to change the fact that the Son of God took on human nature in the womb of Mary and came to birth nine months later. All Christians celebrate this.

CONTRIBUTIONS FOR 2010-2011

The Internal Revenue Service requires us to accredit contributions to a particular year only if we received them during that year or if the contribution has a postmark of that year. This means that we cannot assign credit for 2010 unless we receive the contributions by December 31 or receive them in the mail with a December 31 postmark. The parishes have to abide by federal and state laws.
